Opening in the Spring and accepting referrals now, **Church** is a new dedicated ward for men with an acquired brain injury, and co-occurring complex needs, cognitive deficits and behaviours that may challenge services.



Church ward will sit alongside the established Tallis at the beginning of St Andrew's Brain Injury pathway, helping to meet the demands of growing waiting lists across the sector. It will enable the multidisciplinary team to triage needs and select the most appropriate environment to rapidly stabilise people and support them to progress from admissions to rehabilitation wards at the very earliest opportunity. Allitsen and Tavener provide rehabilitation as patients move through our pathway towards community-facing houses adjacent to our main campus where they can test skills and prepare for their onward journey of recovery.
