> Historic Abuse

Our historic abuse medico-legal reports will look at the sexual, mental and emotional abuse that the claimant may have suffered. This may involve possible breaches in the duty of care from local authorities.

The report will cover:

- life prior to the abuse
- diagnosis and prognosis
- recommendations for future treatment
- impact on employability
- recommendations for compensation.

> Personal Injury and Medical Negligence

> Road Traffic Accidents and Brain injury
